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Admissions Policy for Campion School Sixth Form

Both internal and external students will be required to formally apply to Campion School Sixth Form and attend an interview, where suitability for courses will be discussed.

Acceptance onto A level and BTEC courses is subject to the student meeting the entry requirements and having shown good behaviour and a good attitude towards learning during their GCSE years.

In order to remain a student of Campion sixth form, students must ensure they meet the following criteria. Failure to do so may result in a child being excluded.

All pupils are expected to:

- adhere to the whole school behaviour policy,
- adhere to the sixth form dress code and mobile phone policy,
- have a minimum of 95% attendance,
- work hard in all lessons

Applications will be considered on an individual basis.

Geography (A Level)	GCSE Geography grade 5, English grade 6, GCSE Maths grade 5
Health and Social care (BTEC)	GCSE Health and Social Care grade 4 (C) and/or English grade 5.
History (A Level)	GCSE History grade 5 and grade 6 in GCSE English.
ICT	Five GCSE's at grades 9-3.
Mathematics (A Level)	GCSE Maths grade 6.
Mathematics (Further) (A Level)	GCSE Maths grade 7.

Music (BTEC)	Five GCSE's at grades 9-3.
Philosophy and Ethics (A Level)	GCSE English grade 6.
Photography (A Level)	GCSE English and Maths grade 5.
Physics (A Level)	GCSE Combined Science 6,6 or GCSE Triple Science 6,6,6 plus GCSE Maths grade 6. GCSE English grade 5
Psychology (A Level)	Grade 6 in GCSE English, Maths and Double Science.
Sociology (A Level)	Grade 6 in GCSE English.
Spanish (A Level)	GCSE Spanish grade 6
Sport (BTEC)	Five GCSE's at grades 9-3.
Travel and Tourism (BTEC)	Five GCSE's at grades 9-3.

GCSE Retakes

Students studying at Campion Sixth Form who achieved a GCSE Grade 3 or lower in English and/or Maths will be required to attend GCSE re-take classes and resit these subjects until they achieve a Grade 4.

Oversubscription

In the event that the number of eligible students exceeds the places available at Campion Sixth Form, the following criteria, in order of priority will be used to select from eligible students:

1. Children in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, a local authority and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).
2. Internal students, subject to meeting the entry requirements.
3. External students, subject to meeting the entry requirements.

When the sixth form or a particular course in sixth form is oversubscribed the following factors will be taken into account:

- 1) Attitude to learning in Years 7-11 (references, exclusions data)
- 2) Actual GCSE point scores
- 3) Attendance scores

Pupils will be ranking according to the above and places offered or declined accordingly.

Requirements for Progression from Year 12 to Year 13

Students should receive a minimum of a Grade C in their AS level mocks or a Merit in the first year of their BTEC if they wish to continue with these subjects in Year 13. Students who do not meet these criteria will be required to attend a meeting with the Head of Sixth Form where their progression options will be discussed.
