16 to 19 Tuition Fund Statement

The Department of Education announced funding to support students whose learning was disrupted as a result of the COVID pandemic. This 16-19 Tuition Fund is available to all 16 to 19 providers such as Campion School Sixth Form and is ring-fenced for 16 to 19 small group tuition in English and Maths GCSE only. The purpose of this statement is to set out how Campion School Sixth Form will use its 16 to 19 tuition fund allocation to support students who have been academically disadvantaged due to coronavirus (COVID-19).

How Campion School will use the 16 to 19 tuition fund?

The 16 to 19 tuition fund will be used to provide small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 who have not yet achieved a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths. Tuition groups will comprise of no more than five students and the tuition sessions will be scheduled in addition to the planned programme of study hours already timetabled for the academic year 2020/21. Tuition and additional support may be delivered using a blend of online and on-site delivery.

Who can be supported by this fund?

Support sessions will be prioritised for the following students:

- Students with an Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP)
- Disadvantaged students
- Students who have not yet achieved a 4 or above in GCSE Maths and/or English

How is Campion School Sixth Form using this Fund?

Examples of our Tuition Support on offer:

- GCSE exam re-sit preparation
- Maths and English topic support through tutoring
- Development of knowledge and skills to aid mastery and make up for any shortfall from previous learning.
- Functional skills assessment preparation
- Bespoke subject support and catch up.

Tuition support offered will be based on an individual needs, the identification of an individual's starting point, clear learning goals, expectations and outcomes.

Campion School Sixth Form – What is our pledge?

Campion School is committed to ensuring the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance on the 16 to 19 tuition fund by:

- Producing this statement setting out how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students including students with specific educational needs.
- Publishing this guidance on the school website.
- Recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who receive support, the needs of those students and the number of hours of tuition delivered, whilst retaining the evidence of the tuition provided.
- Delivering the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2020/21
- Notifying the Education Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) of any underspend from the Fund for it to be reclaimed
